ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

The City of New London, under authorization of the 2008 Bond Program has embarked upon a roadway improvement program. With a budget of \$3,540,000, this program involves renovations and improvements of approximately nine (9) miles of roadways throughout the City of New London over two years of construction seasons.

Included in the scope of the project is:

- the removal and replacement of signage;
- removal and installation of new sidewalks, predominately on the north and east sides of streets, with the objective to provide at least one side of all streets safe walk for pedestrians.
- granite curbing installation for all roadways with on both sides of the street; existing granite curbing will be recycled and reset where needed, and new granite curbing will be installed in areas where none exist;
- the reconstruction of all roadways, with the procedure of “cold milling” the pavement and resurfacing with at least one course of bituminous concrete.
- the pruning or removal of trees that have been determined to be creating damage and destruction to City property due to root invasion or been determined by the Tree Warden to be a safety hazard.

The project is planned to be the first phase of a multi-year process to address all 63 miles of City roadways.
